#### > General

- Have a good Tip or Trick? Share with the group at the next meeting!
- This Month's Tip was about how to dry turned pieces
  - Roland recommends a thin EVEN wall thickness put a paper bag over the top and one over the bottom, put this on a rack upside down (opening down). If it's really wet, he wraps the piece in shrink wrap for a week or so with holes in the opening to release moisture before switching to the paper bags.
  - Wayne mentioned (for twice turned pieces) Brett Sousa stores the piece in a plastic bag with the shavings, every week turn the bag inside out and put it back in. Another way is to soak the piece in Denatured Alcohol wrapped in newspaper for a few days before re-turning.

# **Show and Tell**

## **Rick Bugbee**

Catalpa Bowl with Halcyon Finish – (2 Coats) Water based sanding sealer was used as a base/seal coat instead of epoxy to reduce the finishing cost. \*Note Ambrosia Maple did not yellow with this method as it did with epoxy



### **Chris Rowe**

Spalted European Beech Bowl from the grounds of Newport Mansion Chateau-sur-Mer Maple and Spalted Maple Plate/Platters, 18 ¾" platter has crack filled with epoxy and mica powder





#### **Roland Lavoie**

Oak Vase – Let dry to 10% before epoxying to prevent further cracking as Oak cracks from the outside in. Cracks will be filled with Brass Filings before epoxy inside/outside. Notice the space (drive shaft) between tenon and piece, this significantly reduces the likelihood of cracking

Massive Choke Cherry Vase – Approximately 19" Deep!! He's waiting for custom parts to produce 30" Deep!!

Maple Burl/Epoxy Hybrid Bowl (from the wood rack) finished with ACK's Sanding and Wax
Segmented Hollow Form turned for his last graduate student from wood native to the Western Hemisphere – Feature ring is based on a detail from a Frank Lloyd Wright Stained Glass Window
Wood: Mahogany, Bloodwood, Yellowheart, Holly and Katalox finished with 4-5 coats of CrystaLac Brite Tone









