

> Tips and Tricks

- Have a good Tip or Trick? Share with the group at the next meeting!
- This Month's Tips:
 - Roland: When turning really punky wood, if you can't get a good cut with the sharpest tools try soaking the piece with tung oil. Use the finish you plan to use as the final finish (Tung Oil, Walnut Oil, Mineral Oil, etc). Keep in mind you cannot use this technique if you plan to put an incompatible finish on top, epoxy for example would not work.
 - Rick/Roland: When sharpening your tools, most people use black sharpie to align the correct angle for sharpening. You can also use the sharpie on your bowl gouge as you're turning, you'll see how well your presentation is to the wood. If properly 'riding the bevel' you'll be able to see this by how much marker is removed from the bevel
 - Rick/Roland: When using a Fostner bit constantly blow air over the bit, this prevents it from getting hot, no need to back it out every 1/4- 1/2 inch. Also avoids the bit expanding and getting stuck in the wood.
 - Jim: When finishing the bottom of a piece, use self-stick wound tape (tape that only sticks to itself) to cushion the jaws and avoid getting impression/imprints on the finished piece


Sapele, Maple and Cherry Segmented Bowl – Strips are cut at 30deg

Segmented Hollow Form finished with CrystaLac Waterbased Lacquer – Gloss


