



Alex Amoruso Discusses Tangential Turning

Traditional segmented turning is "Radial", in that the segments are oriented as radiating out from the center. By contrast, Tangential" turning orients the sides of the segments tangent to the turned center. The final effect depends on the shape of the core used.





A tangential segment glue-up example, made of 40 pieces cut at 9° each. A purpose-made conical core presses in from the top and spreads the segment array apart. Using a conical core produces an open bowl shape, while a cylindrical core would produce a straight-sided vessel shape. Gaps can be eliminated by removing or adding segments.

Alex created this table saw jig to create and repeat the segment cuts required for the small angle. With careful setup, one can get two segments from a single piece of flat stock.






Alex carefully glues up the segments half of the wedges at a time to make sure he gets the assembly done under the working time of his wood glue. The AAW article suggests that 60-minute epoxy can be used to make the entire glue-up at once.

#64 rubber bands toward the top and bottom of the assembly act as glue-up clamps.

The assembly is mounted and the base is turned flat. Glue on a base piece of wood.

The piece can then be turned and finished as you would a standard bowl or vessel.





Based on the AAW Journal article, Alex built the turning jig shown here. It's made from threaded rod, nuts, and bandsaw-cut circles of plywood, with angles set to match the inside angle of the vessel.


AUGUST MEETING AT CLOUD'S HILL VICTORIAN HOUSE
