Show and Tell



Michael Rinaldi shows his homemade scraper made from $\frac{1}{2}$ " square solid carbide he had from his metal lathe inserted into $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1" piece of a car roof rack.



Paul showing his wall hanging made from cherry, blackwood and manmade Ivory





Bob Hopkins shows his Spalted Maple Bowl, Madrone Bowl, FIB (Found in Basement) Bowl and Spalted Maple Vase



Rick Bugbee shows a Maple Burl which wrapped $\frac{3}{4}$ of the way around a Red Maple tree. He designed this turning around a clam or horseshoe shape





Jay Lima shows a Cherry Burl Bowl sanded to 300 and finished with mineral oil and beeswax.
2. Red Oak honey dipper/baton sanded to 220 and finished with Mylands sanding sealer/polish and hut wax.
3. Norwegian Maple Bowl last month rough. It was full of larva and worm holes. He let it dry for a month. It was very punky so he tried Roland's epoxy technique from this months demo. He went to true it up the next day and this crazy insect hatched and broke through the epoxy and started to come out. He pulled it out of the mortise with a pair of pliers and it's head came off. It's body stayed alive for at least an hour. After dealing with this he finished the bowl with Mylands sanding sealer/polish and Hut wax.
