Ray Lanham Presents his Bowl Making Tools and Techniques




Ray Lanham is a professional woodturner and wood artist of more than 50 years' experience. He's traveled the world, from the USA to Africa, to the Australian Outback, in search of inspiration and exotic wood species. Ray Lanham gave a presentation in which he covered a wide array of topics relating to his bowl making techniques, including his "bowl-from-a-board" economy bowl method, and his stave bowl method. He showed photographs of several of his bowls that show off these various techniques, and discussed tips and tricks he's learned through his long experience. This amounted to far more information than we can possibly relate here in the newsletter!
